

Instructional Modality vs Schedule Type: Definitions for Scheduling Remote Course Sections

<p>Instructional Modality: Can be changed with enrollment in sections but <i>cannot</i> involve a change in the scheduled meeting times. Modality is not necessarily reflected on the schedule of classes other than the room assignment(s); remote sessions will show up as Remote Learning RL.</p>	<p>Schedule Type: Cannot be changed once there is enrollment in a section. Schedule types must be approved at the catalog level before they can be changed at the section level. Schedule type will be coded and appear on the schedule of classes.</p>
<p>On-site/In person: Instruction is delivered in person at the scheduled time.</p>	<p>Lecture (A), Lab (D), Recitation (C), Studio (R), etc.: These follow normal rules for contact hours per credit hour policy (https://registrar.oregonstate.edu/osu-credit-hour-policy)</p>
<p>Remote: Instruction is delivered remotely. Students attend class sessions remotely at scheduled times. If other remote work is performed outside of the scheduled meeting times, it must be done asynchronously so as not to conflict with another class or scheduled event.</p>	<p>Hybrid (HYB): Hybrid schedule type is where part of the course has scheduled meeting times and part is online (https://apa.oregonstate.edu/hybrid-courses). The meetings could be on-site or remote. This schedule type reduces in class meeting time with regards to the credit hour policy.</p>
<p>Hybrid/Blended: Instruction will have some portions delivered remotely and some on-site/in person. Students attend class at a scheduled time, whether remotely or in person. This could include either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) having the entire class present in person for one session while another session is entirely remote, or b) adopting a rotational approach where a portion of the class meets in person while the other portion(s) attends remotely for the same session (then the groups switch modalities for the next period), or c) another approach that meets this spirit (some in-person meetings) and ensures sufficient contact hours for all students. 	<p>Online (Y): This will generally follow online modality with limited exceptions.</p>
<p>Online: All course materials are delivered virtually with no requirements for students to attend class at a specified time.</p>
